This training consists of (1) - 3 hour session which is watching a movie called "Protecting God's Children", and follow-up training bulletins via computer emails. They have made certification in VIRTUS a **mandatory** requirement if you are involved in volunteering for any programs which involve contact with children in religious education or school. This includes coaches, school aides, afterschool care workers, homeroom moms, chaperones for field trips, substitute teachers, catechists, scout leaders, etc. All parents/adults are welcome to take part.

WHAT DO YOU KNOW ABOUT ISLAM?

1. Islam is a religion.
2. A Muslim is a follower of the Islam faith.
3. "Muslim" means "one who is in submission to the divine will".
4. Muhammad founded the religion and received his first of many "revelations" at age 40 from the angel Gabriel. They continued for 23 years.
5. Having memorized these "revelations", Muhammad would go back to the scribes who would write them down.
6. The book in which these revelations were written is known as the Qur'an or Koran.
7. To the Muslim, every word of the Qur'an is the word of God.
8. It contains many moral exhortations, forming the basis of Islamic law.
9. It spells out generosity and fairness and the five obligatory duties:
 1. Reciting the creed, "There is no God but Allah".
 2. Pray five times a day facing Mecca.
 3. Tithe to the poor and for furtherance of Islam.
 4. Fast for one month each year during the 9th month, Ramadan. This month of fasting is during the day only. Feasting takes place after sundown.
 5. Make a pilgrimage to Mecca at least once during a lifetime.
